Narrative Poem

Directions:

- A. Create a narrative poem. Remember Narrative Poems have a plot or a storyline. You need to take one of your "snapshots" or "small moments" and create a poem based on the experience.
- B. The poem should follow a **rhyme scheme** of your choice. Every line gets its own letter based on the rhyme. If the rhyme is repeated then it should be assigned the same letter.

For example in the first stanza of the poem below, the last word in the first line is "dress", which makes the first line gets labeled with the letter A. The next line ends with "do", which doesn't rhyme with dress, and therefore gets the letter B. The third line ends with "shoe", which does rhyme with "do" so it would also get labeled with the letter B. The fourth line ends in "mess", which rhymes with "dress", so the fourth line will receive the same letter A. In the second stanza, a new rhyme scheme begins.

- C. The lines of your poem should be at least four words long in order to keep up the rhythm and fluency. Your poem should be at least 16 lines and constructed into 4 stanzas.
- D. Poem must include four of the following devices used correctly to add meaning to the story:

Alliteration, Imagery, Metaphor, Onomatopoeia, Personification, Repetition, and Simile

- E. You must include at least one colored illustration that has a definite connection or relationship to the poem.
- F. Your poem must be typed or handwritten in cursive using ink. IT MUST BE ON UNLINED PAPER!
